- Colour variations

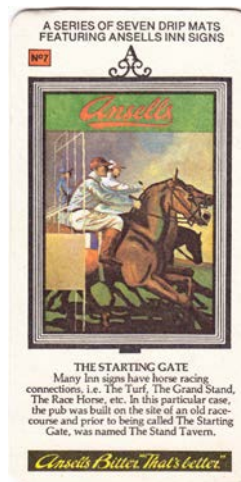
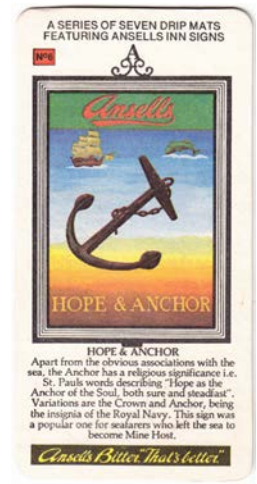
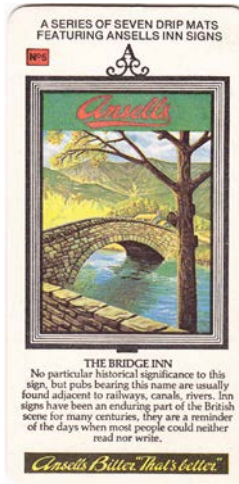
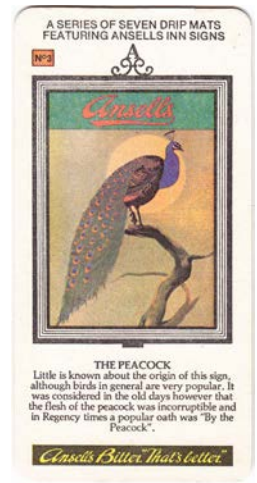
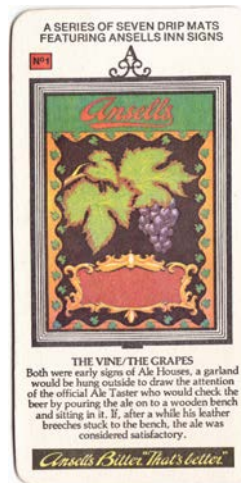
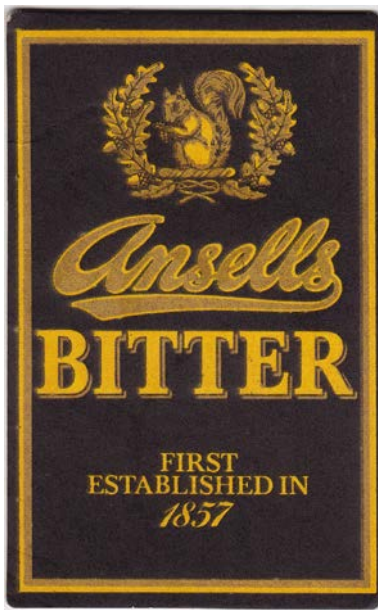

Your landlord won't serve it until it's reached its full character, lying on its side, at the right temperature, in his cellar. GREAT ENGINEERS SERIES
 ISAMBARD KINGDOM BRUNEL
 1806 - 1889



Builder of ships, bridges, railways and docks. His Great Western Railway connects four Courage breweries in Plymouth, Reading, Bristol and London.

MAIDENHEAD BRIDGE - 1838
 Still the longest brick span in the world at 2 x 128 ft, the bridge is also remarkable for the flatness of its arches. Brunel's design was followed for the 1892 widening.

BOX TUNNEL
 Constructed between 1836 and 1841, it was perhaps the greatest earthwork since the Great Wall of China. The sun is said to shine through the tunnel on, and only on, Brunel's birthday - April 9th.

 She was the first commercially viable transatlantic steamship; in the great race of 1838 she started several days behind and was beaten to New York by only a few hours.

PADDINGTON STATION - 1854
 "I am going to design, in a great hurry, and I believe to build, a station after my own fancy". Brunel was by now much influenced by Paxton's Crystal Palace.

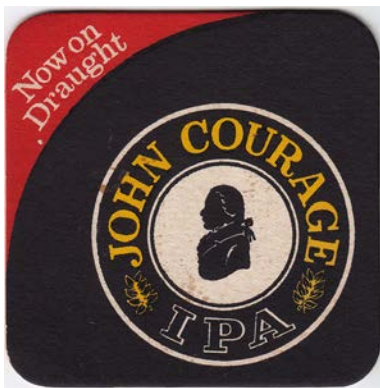
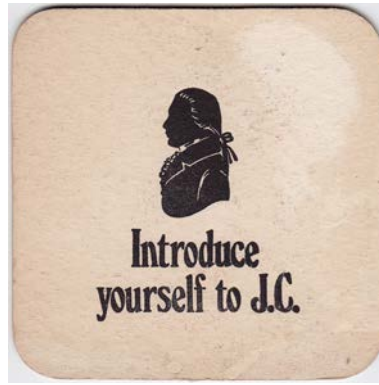
Alex James, the baggy-trousered show man, learnt his early football skills in the streets of Glasgow- and generally at ground level.
